Y3/4 Kho Kho Festival

On Friday 4th December, Y3/4 pupils from Bewdley, Stourport, Hartlebury, Offmore, Cookley, Burlish Park and Lickhill Primary Schools took part in a Kho Kho Festival - an Indian Tag game - in Stourport High School's LQ Arena.

Targeting pupils that don't usually represent their school or have low activity levels, teams played each other in a round-robin competition.

Supported by Young Leaders from Stourport, Bewdley and King Charles High Schools, the Y3/4

pupils developed their communication and teamwork skills, as well as their tactics for playing the game.



KS3 and KS4 Badminton

Students from Wolverley and King Charles High Schools took part in the KS3 and KS4 Badminton competition at The Glades on Tuesday 8th December. Students played singles and doubles matches against

each other in a round-robin competition, resulting in King Charles winning the KS3 boys, KS3 girls and KS4 boys events and Wolverley winning the KS4 girls event.



All of the winning teams will now progress to the county finals, organised by Badminton England, that will take place at the University of Worcester on 2nd February, as Wyre Forest representatives.
