Y3/4 Quicksticks Hockey

On 16th November, over 250 pupils from Cookley, Franche, Holy Trinity, Burlish Park, St Anne's, Bewdley, Hagley, St John's, Stourport, Comberton, The Knoll, Foley Park, Birchen Coppice, Hartlebury and Wolverley Primary Schools took part in the Y3/4 Quicksticks Hockey Festival. Supported by Leaders from

The Bewdley School, a competition took place for both large and small schools. Teams were put into mini-leagues, with play-offs to decide the overall winners. Comberton won the large schools competition and Wolverley won the small schools competition.

Cross Country events

On Friday 11th and 18th November, Wyre Forest School Sport Partnership's annual Cross Country events took place.

On 11th, over 600 pupils from a record 27 Primary Schools took part in the KS2 event, which took place at St Anne's Primary School.

Races took place for Y5 girls, Y5 boys, Y6 girls and Y6 boys, with the top 5 place runners from each school, earning points for their team. The competition was split into small and large schools. Hagley won the large schools competition, with Burlish Park in 2nd and Holy Trinity in 3rd. Chaddesley Corbett won the small schools competition, with Hartlebury in 2nd and St Oswald's in 3d.



The following week, in the Wyre Forest, the KS3/4 Cross Country took place.

There were races for girls and boys in Y7, Y8/9 and Y10/11, with runners covering increasing longer distances.

Y3/4 Kho Kho Festival

On Friday 2nd December, Y3/4 pupils from Foley Park, Birchen Coppice, Hartlebury, Burlish Park, Chaddesley, Franche, Lickhill, St John's, Upper Arley, Heathfield, Stourport, St Bart's Hagley, Cookley, St Anne's and Bewdley Primary Schools

took part in a Kho Kho Festival - an Indian Tag game. Targeting pupils that don't usually represent their school or have low activity levels, teams played each other in mini-leagues. Supported by Young Leaders from King Charles, Baxter College, Stourport

and Bewdley High Schools, the Y3/4 pupils developed their communication and teamwork skills, as well as tactics for playing the game.



KS3 and KS4 Badminton

Cross Country

On Friday 7th October, pupils from Birchen Coppice, Franche, Foley Park and St John's Primary Schools took part in a Family Cross Country event at Baxter College.

On arrival, schools were mixed into small groups and Sixth Form leaders delivered a warm up. The pupils were then split into girls and boys for their races. Medals were awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each race.



Tag Rugby

On 4th November, Y3/4 and Y5/6 pupils from Birchen Coppice, Foley Park, St John's and Sutton Park Primary School took part in a Tag Rugby Festival at Baxter College.

The day was split into two sessions – Y3/4 in the morning and Y5/6 in the afternoon. 229 pupils took part in total. Schools were put into mixed teams and sent to a group of leader for a warm up. From there, they completed a carousel of 4 skills sessions before finishing with a round-robin tournament.



Bewdley Family round-up

Cross Country

Over 180 Y5/6 pupils from St Anne's, Sutton Park, Franche, Far Forest and Upper Arley Primary Schools took part in the Family Cross Country on Tuesday 27th September, ahead of the Partnership's KS2 event.

There was a boys race and a girls which were marshalled by 14 Y9 Leaders from The Bewdley School.

Alex from Far Forest won the girls race, which had 84 runners in, and Joseph from St Anne's won the boys race, which saw 98 runners compete.

Tag Rugby

Pupils from Far Forest, Upper Arley, St Anne's and Bewdley Primary Schools competed against the Stourport Primary Schools at the annual Tag Rugby Festival on Friday 21st October.

Bewdley Primary School were the top finishing Bewdley school in the Y3/4 event, finishing 2nd overall, and Upper Arley were the top finishing Bewdley school in the Y5/6 competition, finishing 2nd overall.

Wolverley Family round-up

Cross Country

On Monday 3rd October, 94 pupils from Franche and St Oswald's Primary Schools took part in a Family Cross Country event at Wolverley CE Secondary School. Young Leaders from Wolverley, led a series of warm up activities for the Y5 and Y6 pupils before the races began. There were races for Y5 girls and boys and Y6 girls and boys, which the schools were using a trials in order to select their teams for the Partnership's Cross Country.

Tag Rugby

On 4th November, pupils from Cookley, St Oswald's and Franche Primary Schools attended the Family Tag Rugby Festival, which was held at Kidderminster Carolians Rugby Club. Competitions took place for Y3/4 and Y5/6 pupils. Young Leaders from Wolverley CE Secondary led a warm up and officiated matches, which were played in a round-robin format. Certificates were awarded to pupils for sportsmanship, 'top tagger', best try and team work.

Stourport Family round-up

Cross Country

On Friday 7th October, 197 KS2 pupils from Stourport, Wilden, Burlish Park and St Bartholomew's Primary Schools took part in a Family Cross Country event at Memorial Park.

The event enabled schools to select their teams for the District event, taking place in November.

Schools were encouraged to enter A, B, C and D teams into the event so that as many pupils as possible got the opportunity to compete and represent their school.

Tag Rugby

Pupils from Burlish Park, St Bartholomew's, Hartlebury, Stourport, Holy Trinity and Wilden competed in the annual Tag Rugby Festival at Stourport Rugby Club on 21st October.

Over 120 pupils took part in the Festival, which had competitions for Y3/4 and Y5/6. All teams played each other in a round-robin with Burlish Park winning both the Y3/4 and Y5/6 events. Both competitions were supported by Young Leaders from Stourport High School.
