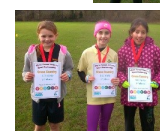

## KS2 Cross Country

On Friday 12th February, Wyre Forest School Sport Partnership's annual KS2 Cross Country took place. 23 schools entered the event, held at St Anne's Primary School, competing in the large and small schools competitions. Races took place for girls and boys in Years 5 and 6, with the top 5 runners earning points for their team. When the points from all the

runners were totalled, Hagley Primary won the large schools competition followed by Burlish Park (2nd) and St Anne's (3rd). Hartlebury Primary won the small schools competition followed by Lickhill (2nd) and Chaddesley Corbett (3rd). The top 6 placed athletes will now progress to the County Finals, representing the Wyre Forest.



## Celebration of Inclusive Sport

On Friday 22nd January, over 130 pupils from across the Wyre Forest, took part in this year's 'Celebration of Inclusive Sport'.

KS2 and KS3 pupils with physical, sensory and/or learning disabilities from St George's, St Anne's, Burlish Park, Franche, Comberton, Cookley, Bewdley, Stourport and St John's Primary Schools, along with students

from Baxter College, King Charles, The Bewdley School, Stourport High School and The Wyre Forest School attended the event, supported by Young Leaders from Stourport and King Charles.



During the morning of the Festival, KS2 pupils took part in an Arrows Festival, a modified version of Archery. This competition was won by Burlish Park Primary School.

In the afternoon, KS2 and KS3 pupils played Boccia and New Age Kurling. All of the winning teams will now progress to the Worcestershire School Games.

## KS3/4 Leadership training

High School students have been busy gaining leadership qualifications over the last couple of months...students from King Charles, Bewdley and Stourport High Schools accessed a Junior Football Leader course, delivered by Worcestershire FA, on 7th December. Students from Baxter College,
