As part of the Opening Ceremony, which took place in the Arena, pupils from The Knoll School performed their School Games anthem, which

Netball Leader training

Students from Baxter College, Wolverley, King Charles, Bewdley and Stourport High Schools took part in a Netball Leaders course on 26th February.

Delivered by England Netball, the selected students learnt how to officiate Netball games and gained a better understanding of the rules of the game.

The Netball Leaders now have to practice their officiating skills and undertake a written test before being observed umpiring a match. Once qualified, the Netball Leaders can then umpire matches for their school and local Netball clubs.

A record number of 20 teams entered this year's Y5/6 Netball League.

Taking place over 4 weeks at the Netball Dome, teams played games in mini-leagues.

Despite one rained effected week, teams from Burlish Park, Sutton Park, Lickhill, St Anne's, Foley Park, Stourport, Holy Trinity, St Bartholomew's, Franche, Cookley, Offmore, Hagley, Heronswood, Comberton, St John's, Bewdley, Birchen Coppice and Hartlebury, St George's all played 9 matches

There were some notable individual performances from Scarlett Holloway from Burlish Park (2nd in the Y5

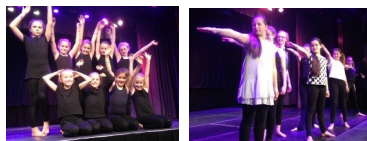

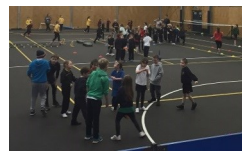
