## WFSSP Dance Festivals

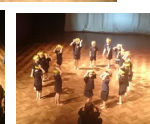
Baxter College hosted a series of Dance Festivals that took place on Wednesday 22nd, Thursday 23rd and Friday 24th March.

Each Festival was well attended with between 12 - 15 dances being performed at each event.

Pupils from Reception to Y13 performed, showcasing a range of class work, work from after-school clubs and examination pieces, 620 pupils from Foley Park, St Anne's, Sutton Park, St Bartholomew's, Franche, Upper Arley, Comberton, Chaddesley Corbett, Lickhill,

Wilden, Bewdley, Burlish Park, Cookley and Stourport Primary Schools were joined by students from King Charles, Wyre Forest School, Baxter College, Wolverley, Bewdley and Stourport High Schools.

All performers took part in a warm up and had the chance to perform their dances in front of an audience of over 200 people.



## Y5/6 and Y7/8 Orienteering

On Friday 31st March, Y5/6 pupils from Sutton Park, Far Forest, Hagley, Hartlebury, Franche, Bewdley, Burlish Park, Comberton, Lickhill, St Anne's, Heathfield, Chaddesley Corbett, St George's and St John's Primary Schools attended a Y5/6 Orienteering Festival in the grounds of Wolverley CE Secondary School.

Pupils competed in teams of 4, and had to stay together, to complete the course in the fastest possible time.

There were 2 sessions that the Primary Schools could attend and teams were 'sent off' in waves so that there was sufficient distance between pupils.

Burlish Park were the winning

large school, with Burlish Park B in 2nd and Franche in 3rd. Heathfield won the small school event with teams from St George's finishing 2nd and 3rd. Y7/8 students completed a similar course in the afternoon.

Haybridge 4 won the event, with Stourport Unicorns in 2nd and Haybridge 2 in 3rd.

## U15 Handball Festival

Students from The Bewdley School, Wolverley, Stourport, King Charles and Haybridge High Schools all took part in an exciting new event for 2017 - Handball!

Separate competitions took place for girls and boys - 3 teams competed in the boys event and 5 teams in the girls.

Trained Young Leaders from Haybridge and Stourport officiated the games, which were fast and frantic. King Charles won the boys event and Bewdley won the girls event, with both teams progressing to the Winter School Games as the Wyre Forest representatives.

## Health and Well-being Festival

Over 240 KS2 'less active' pupils from Comberton, Holy Trinity, Franche, Burlish Park, Wilden, St John's, Bewdley, Upper Arley, St George's and Cookley Primary Schools took part in a Health and Well-Being Festival on Monday 6th March at Stourport Athletics track. Supported by 68 Leaders from Stourport High School, pupils

completed a series of Change4Life activities, solved problems around diet and nutrition, before completing a 5000m team relay challenge. All of the pupils had a fantastic time, with one pupils saying they would be having salad instead of chips for their dinner that evening!

## Y5/6 Netball League and Netball Leader training

## Bewdley and Stourport Family round up

### KSI Multi-skills

On the afternoon of Friday 27th January, 84 KSI pupils from Holy Trinity, Hartlebury, Lickhill, Wilden and Burlish Park Primary Schools took part in a Multi-skills Festival at Stourport Dome.

The KSI pupils were supported by 20 KS2 Young Leaders from Lickhill, Burlish Park and Wilden, who led the younger pupils through a series of fun activities that helped to develop their fundamental movement skills, such as throwing, catching and aiming.

The Bewdley Family enjoyed their KSI Multi-skills Festival at Bewdley Leisure Centre on the same day, with pupils from Franche, Bewdley, Far Forest and St Anne's taking part.

The Festival was supported by 21 Young Leaders from Year 9 at The Bewdley School, who led a rotation of 8 different multi skill activities.

Pupils then enjoyed playing some parachute games at the end of the Festival.

### Y3/4 Problem Solving Festival

Y3/4 pupils from Burlish Park, St Bartholomew's, Hartlebury and Holy Trinity were joined by pupils from Far Forest, Bewdley and St Anne's Primary Schools to participate in an Outdoor and Adventurous Festival, which focused on problem solving. The Festival, which took place on Friday 17th March in the Dome at Stourport High School, saw 62 pupils with low



self-esteem or who don't usually represent their school in PE/sporting activities, working in small groups to overcome a series of challenges.

30 Young Leaders from Stourport High School confidently led each 'station', which were designed to get the pupils to work co-operatively and to think about solutions to various activity related challenges.



## Wolverley, Kidderminster and Habberley Family round up

### Multi-skills

KSI pupils from Heathfield and Franche got the opportunity to attend a KSI Multi-skills Festival. The Festival, which took place on Monday 23rd January at Wolverley CE Secondary School, saw the 45 pupils complete a circuit of multi-skill activities which were designed to develop co-ordination, balance and movement. Each of the activities in the

circuit were delivered by Young Leaders from Wolverley. 180 pupils from Comberton, St Kenelm's, Heronswood, St George's and Chaddesley Corbett Primary Schools also participated in the KSI Multi-skills Festival that took place on Friday 27th January at King Charles I School. The Festival, which had a morning and an afternoon session, allowed schools to

bring whole classes to participate. During the Festival, which was supported by Young Leaders from King Charles, pupils rotated round 10 activities, which developed their object control, locomotion and stability. After having to postpone their original event, due to freezing conditions, the rescheduled Habberley Multi-skills Festival took place on Friday 17th

March at Baxter College. 168 pupils from Franche, Wyre Forest School, Sutton Park, Birchen Coppice, Foley Park and St John's Primary Schools attended the Festival, working in small groups of 6-8 to complete a series of activities. The activities, led by Young Leaders from Baxter College, included passing drills, target games, relays and boxing.
