Celebration of Inclusive Sport

On Friday 23 January over 160 students from across the Wyre Forest area, supported by 27 Young Leaders, took part in this year's 'Celebration of Inclusive Sport'.

Students from Burlish Park, Far Forest, Bewdley, St Bartholomew's and St Anne's Primary Schools, along with students from King Charles 1, Stourport High School and The Wyre Forest School with physical, sensory and/or learning disabilities from Years 1 to 13 attended the event, which took place at the Glades Leisure Centre.

During the morning session, Key Stage 1 students rotated round

5 multi-skill activity stations, led by Young Leaders from King Charles, Bewdley, Wolverley and Stourport High Schools, developing their striking, target, balance and co-ordination skills.



As well as completing the multi-skills activities, Key Stage 2 students were given the opportunity to play Boccia, New Age Kurling and have a go at Archery Arrows.



In the afternoon high school students played more games of Boccia and New Age Kurling, then tried out the Archery Arrows as well as a variety of other multi-skills.
