Orienteering Festival

Y5/6 pupils from Franche, Comberton, Burlish Park, Hartlebury, Stourport, Foley Park, The Knoll, St George's, Bewdley, Lickhill, St Anne's, Cookley, Hartlebury, Holy Trinity, Birchen Coppice and Offmore Primary Schools took part in this year's Orienteering Festival at Wolverley CE Secondary School on Friday 22nd April.

On Tuesday 17th May, 120 Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 pupils from Burlish Park, Cookley, Hartlebury, Holy Trinity, The Knoll, Bewdley, Stourport, Hagley, Franche and Far Forest Primary Schools took part in the SSP's Tennis Festival, held at Bewdley Tennis Club. During the Festival, pupils worked in teams to complete the courses, trying to find the 20 control points in the quickest possible time, whilst developing their map reading, communication and problem solving skills. In the afternoon, Y7/8 pupils from Wolverley, Stourport and King Charles High Schools attended the Festival

to develop their orienteering skills.

The teams from The Knoll, Lickhill and St George's (small schools), Burlish Park (large schools) and Stourport High School (Y7/8) will all go on to represent the Wyre Forest at the School Games L3 event.

Tennis Festival

Bewdley and Stourport High Schools. Teams played in 3 leagues, with the winners of each league playing-off to determine an overall winner. The teams from Franche, Holy Trinity and Hagley all won their leagues in both competitions, with Holy Trinity winning the Y3/4 and Y5/6 finals. The pupils from Holy Trinity

will now represent the Wyre Forest at the Summer School Games.



Golf Festivals

Y3/4 pupils from across the Wyre Forest have taken part in Tri-Golf Festivals this half term. Prior to the Festival, students from Bewdley, Wolverley and Stourport High Schools received training that enabled them to support the Festival and offer coaching to the teams, which were made up of 5 boys and 5 girls. Pupils rotated round 8 activity stations, scoring points for their team. After all the Festivals had taken place, the

team from The Knoll had scored the most points. Y7 pupils from The Bewdley School and Stourport High School also took part in a Golf competition. The Y7 pupils completed 3 different activities; a 6 hole course, won by Tom Reading (Stourport), Dan Houghton (Stourport) won 'nearest the pin' and Byron Hignell Halford (Bewdley) won the 'longest drive' competitions.

Athletics Festivals

On 13th May, students from King Charles, Haybridge, Stourport and Wolverley competed in the Super 6 Athletics competition. All students had to take part in one track (sprint, middle and long distance), one field (javelin, long jump, shot) and one relay (4x100m, mixed medley) event, scoring points for their team. Haybridge won the Y7/8 event and Stourport won

Y9 event. The same afternoon, KS2 SEND pupils from The Wyre Forest School, St Anne's, Burlish Park, St George's, Franche and St John's took part in a Quad-Kids Athletics competition. All pupils took part in 75m, 400m, howler throw and long jump. Medals were presented to the individual winners of each event and to the top scoring individual boy and girl.
