On Tuesday 5th July, over 1000 pupils from schools across the county, took part in Worcestershire's L3 School Games at Bromsgrove School.

The School Games began with an opening ceremony, which Free Radio compered, assisted by Young Ambassadors from across the county. This was followed by some inspirational words from Paralympic Swimmer, Kate Grey, who declared the Games 'open'! All of the competitors then took part in a mass warm up, led by Bhangra Dancer, Sohan Kailey, before heading off to their competitions. Competitors from each District wore different coloured t-shirts that

represent the School Games values - the 140 Wyre Forest pupils wore blue representing 'Honesty'. The competitors were supported in their events by Young Leaders, who took on officiating and Team Support roles. Over 50 Young Leaders from King Charles I School and Stourport High School took part, supporting the 13 competitions taking place in 9 different sports: Archery, Athletics, Boccia, Cricket, Golf, Rounders, Rugby, Swimming and Tennis. To compliment the sports events, a 'School Games Cultural Village' was set up, engaging pupils and spectators in some interactive activities.

As part of the Village, students from Stourport High School showcased some of their 'Change4Life' activities.

Percy Pear, Worcestershire's School Games Mascot, was



also in attendance, cheering on all the competitors! There were some notable performances from:

1st: Holy Trinity - Y3/4 Tennis, Y5/6 Tennis and Y5/6 Swimming

3rd: Hagley Primary - Y4 Cricket



Dodgeball Festival

On Friday 10th June, over 200 KS2 Pupil Premium pupils competed in a Dodgeball Festival, which took place in the Dome at Stourport High School. Supported by Leaders from Stourport High School and The Bewdley School, teams from the Wyre Forest School, Far Forest, Holy Trinity, Bewdley, Sutton Park, St Bartholomew's, St George's, Burlish Park, Cookley, Heronswood,

Offmore, Birchen Coppice, Foley Park, Chaddesley Corbett and Comberton Primary Schools competed in 4 mini-leagues. The games were fast and frantic, with some teams achieving 'wipe outs' before the game was over. WFSSP wristbands were awarded to the team winning each mini-league; Far Forest 1, Far Forest 2, St Bartholomew's 1 and St George's 1.

Year 5/6 Rounders League

10 teams entered this year's Y5/6 Rounders League, which took place at Baxter College. Taking place over 3 weeks, after the first week was rained off, teams all played timed innings matches. Supported by Young Leaders from Baxter College, who umpired matches, the teams from Burlish Park, St Anne's, Foley Park, Franche, Cookley, Offmore, St John's, Birchen Coppice, Hartlebury and St George's played 9 matches

each, playing in a round robin competition.

Franch Primary School ended up as overall winners, followed by St Anne's in 2nd and Hartlebury in 3rd place, narrowly beating Burlish Park into 4th place by 'rounders' difference.

Change4Life celebration event

On Monday 20th June, pupils from Burlish Park, Franche, St George's and Stourport Primary Schools attended a Change4Life (C4L) Celebration event at Stourport High School. For the pupils who attended, this was a reward

trip for their continued attendance at their school C4L club.

During the event, pupils rotated round 10 activity stations - 5 which focused on themed Change4Life activities and 5 which focused on food and diet.

The activities were led by Y7, 8 and 9 students from Stourport High School, who were delivering the event as part of their remit for being Worcestershire's Health and Well-being Lead School. At the end of the event, all

of the pupils were presented with a C4L '10 minute shake up' pack which gives them lots of 10 minute activities that they can complete over the Summer holidays and a sticker book to record their activity levels.

Y6 Transition

On Wednesday 6th July, 140 Y6 pupils, who will be starting at The Bewdley School in September, attended a Transition Festival.

The Festival, which took place at Bewdley Leisure Centre, was supported by The Bewdley School's 3 Young Ambassadors (Y10) and 20 Young Leaders (Y9). The Y6 pupils experienced a series of activities which included Kho Kho, Archery, seated Hockey, Parachute games and problem solving activities.

Y3/4 Tri-Golf

On Friday 29th April, 50 Y3/4 pupils from Holy Trinity, Burlish Park, Lickhill, Wilden and Stourport Primary Schools took part in a Tri-Golf Festival at Bewdley Leisure Centre.

Supported by 16 Young Leaders, from Stourport High School, pupils rotated round 8 activity stations, scoring points for their team. The team from Burlish Park won.

KS1 Striking and Fielding

On Friday 20th May, KS1 pupils from Stourport, St Bartholomew's, Burlish Park, Lickhill, Holy Trinity and Wilden Primary Schools attended a Striking and Fielding Festival, led by Y6 Young Leaders from Wilden, Burlish Park and Stourport.

Pupils completed in 8 stations all which developed their fielding, batting and running skills in striking and fielding games.

KS2 Biathlon

On Wednesday 6th June, Y4, 5 and 6 pupils from St Bartholomew's, Holy Trinity and Burlish Park Primary Schools took part in our first ever Biathlon event at Holy Trinity School.

To register a time, pupils had to swim 4 lengths of the pool and then run 3 laps of the running track. Certificates were presented to the 3 pupils with the quickest times. The event was fantastically managed by the staff at Holy Trinity and their leaders.
