## Y5/6 Rounders Festival

On Monday 26th June, to launch National School Sport Week, pupils from Birchen Coppice, St Anne's, Foley Park, Burlish Park, Franche, Holy Trinity, Lickhill, Upper Arley, Hartlebury, Cookley, and St Bartholomew's Primary Schools all took part in a Y5/6 Rounders Festival, which took place at Bewdley Leisure Centre.

Playing in 2 mini-leagues, all games were centrally timed. Teams played 5 matches which were umpired by WFSSP staff, before play-off games took place. As Franche and Burlish Park both won their mini-league, they competed in the 1st place play-off, with the team from Franche ending up victorious.

On Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> July, over 800 pupils from schools across the county, took part in Worcestershire's Summer School Games at Bromsgrove School.

The School Games began with an opening ceremony, which was compered by Free Radio.

This was followed by some inspirational words from Sporting Champion, cyclist Annasley Park, who declared the Games 'open'!



Pupils from each District wore different coloured t-shirts that represent the School Games values - the 130 Wyre Forest pupils wore pink for 'Passion'. Competitors were supported in their events by Young Leaders, who officiated events.

Young Leaders from Baxter College, The Bewdley School, Haybridge High and Stourport High Schools took part, supporting the 13 competitions taking place in 9 different sports: Archery, Athletics, Boccia, Cricket, Tri-Golf, Lacrosse, Rounders, Swimming and Tennis.



To compliment the sports events, a 'School Games Village' was set up, engaging pupil in some interactive activities.

There were some notable performances from: Holy Trinity 1st in Y5/6 Swimming,

Hagley Primary 1st in Y5/6 Tennis & Y4 Cricket, Stourport Primary 1st in KS2 Boccia, Baxter College 1st & 2nd in KS3 Boccia, Burlish Park 2nd in Y3/4 Tri-Golf & 3rd in Archery and Stourport High 3rd in the Y7/8 Athletics.



## KS2 Dodgeball Festival

On Friday 9<sup>th</sup> June, over 230 KS2 Pupil Premium pupils competed in a Dodgeball Festival, which took place in the Dome at Stourport High School.

Supported by Leaders from Stourport High School, teams from Far Forest, Burlish Park, Bewdley, Lickhill, Hartlebury, Holy Trinity, Franche, Hagley,

Cookley, Heronswood, Foley Park, Comberton, Chaddesley Corbett, Birchen Coppice and Sutton Park Primary Schools competed in 4 mini-leagues. The games, which lasted 2

minutes, were fast and frantic, with some teams achieving 'wipe outs'!



WFSSP wristbands were awarded to the winners of each mini-league as well as to pupils who had shown excellent teamwork skills.

## KS2 and KS3/4 Team Athletics events

On Friday 23rd June, pupils from Burlish Park, Bewdley, St Anne's, Hagley, Holy Trinity, Foley Park, Birchen Coppice, Sutton Park, St Bartholomew's, Far Forest, St George's, St Oswald's and Franche Primary Schools took part in the KS2 Team Athletics.

An opening ceremony took place at the start of the event, with each team invited to parade with a school banner or flag.

Pupils competed in the hurdles, 80m, 300m, 600m, javelin, shot,

long jump, triple jump, high jump and relays.

Certificates were awarded to the pupils who won each event, with some setting new District records! Hagley Primary won the large schools competition and Sutton Park Primary won the small schools competition.

The following week, KS3 and KS4 students from Baxter College, The Bewdley School, Haybridge, King Charles, Stourport and Wolverley High Schools took part in the

KS3/4 Team Athletics.

Separate competitions took place for girls and boys in Year 7, Year 8 and Y9/10 combined.

Pupils competed in the 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m, 1500m, shot, discus, javelin, high jump, long jump, triple jump and relay.

Stourport High School won the Y7 boys, Y7 girls, Y8 girls, Y9/10 girls and Y9/10 boys

competitions, with Haybridge winning the Y8 boys competition.

## Bewdley, Stourport and Kidderminster Family round up

On Friday 26th May, just under 100 KS1 pupils from Stourport, Burlish Park, Holy Trinity, Hartlebury, Far Forest and St Bartholomew's Primary Schools took part in a Striking and Fielding Festival, that was hosted by Stourport High School.

The event was supported by 16 Young Leaders from Stourport High School and 16 Young Leaders from Burlish Park. The Young Leaders led a series of Striking and Fielding activities, which the younger pupils rotated round.

Although there were no overall winners, pupils who demonstrated particular skills during the event, were rewarded with WFSSP wristbands.

Instead of having a Striking and Fielding Festival this term, the Kidderminster Family of schools opted for Sports Day support from King Charles staff and students.

Toni Cariss, Head of PE at King Charles, complimented the Primary Schools on their Sports Days, commenting on how well organised they were.

## Wolverley and Habberley Family round up

On Friday 26th May, Y1 and Y2 pupils from Foley Park, Franche and Birchen Coppice Primary Schools took part in KS1 Striking and Fielding Festival at Baxter College.

The KS1 pupils, assisted by Young Leaders from Baxter College, rotated round a series of skills stations and challenges that developed their striking and fielding abilities. In addition to this, Mr Turner from Baxter College, who plays cricket to a high standard, offered each Primary School in the Family a morning or afternoon of

cricket coaching. Franche, Foley Park, Sutton Park and Birchen Coppice Primary Schools all accessed the delivery, which resulted in a cricket tournament at Baxter College on Friday 7th July.

Franche, Heathfield Knoll, Cookley and St Oswald's have also accessed the delivery, providing Young Leaders to support the Festival, leading the activity stations for the younger pupils to rotate round. They also chose one or two KS1 classes with the opportunity to take part in the Festival.

## Y9 Rounders Festival

On Tuesday 9th June, Y9 students from King Charles, Baxter College, The Bewdley School, Haybridge, Holy Trinity and Stourport High Schools took part in a Y9 Rounders competition. Playing innings of 20 good balls, teams played in a round-robin, all playing each other once.

The teams from Baxter College and Stourport High both finished on equal points, but the team from Baxter had a better points difference, meaning they progressed to Worcestershire's Summer School Games as the Wyre Forest representatives.
